1 – What institutional set-up has been put in place for the implementation of the National Strategy (e.g. communication, cross-government coordination)?

[Implementation of Malawi's Climate Change Learning Strategy follows the formal multi-stakeholder structure as provided in the National Climate Change Management Policy. This set up allows for various groups of stakeholders to be involved in climate change management in the country by participating in the technical committee review meetings and steering committee meetings (Relevant Government Departments and Ministries, Academia, Civil society organisations and the Media). The Strategy is implemented using the Environment and Climate Change Communication Strategy that was developed for the sector.
