We help partner countries establish their NDCs and NAPs by promoting intersectional and coordinated climate change action through a coordinated approach to education and learning.





## **Engaging with Learning Institutions**

We work alongside national education and training institutions to integrate climate change education in their curricula.

## Strengthening Youth Capacity

We strive to strengthen youth capacity and youth networks so they can actively participate in the climate change debate and take informed action on climate change.





## Learning for Citizens and Professionals

We provide free e-learning resources to the public in multiple formats that are also accessible to persons with disability. We also provide training opportunities that spark changes to attitudes and behaviors in matters related to climate change.


## Strategic Approach to Climate Change Learning in Partner Countries




